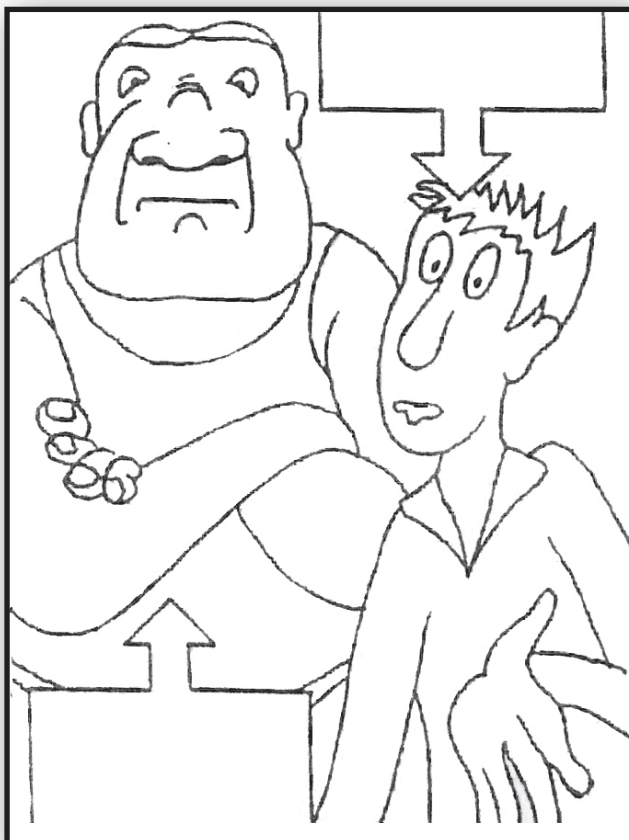
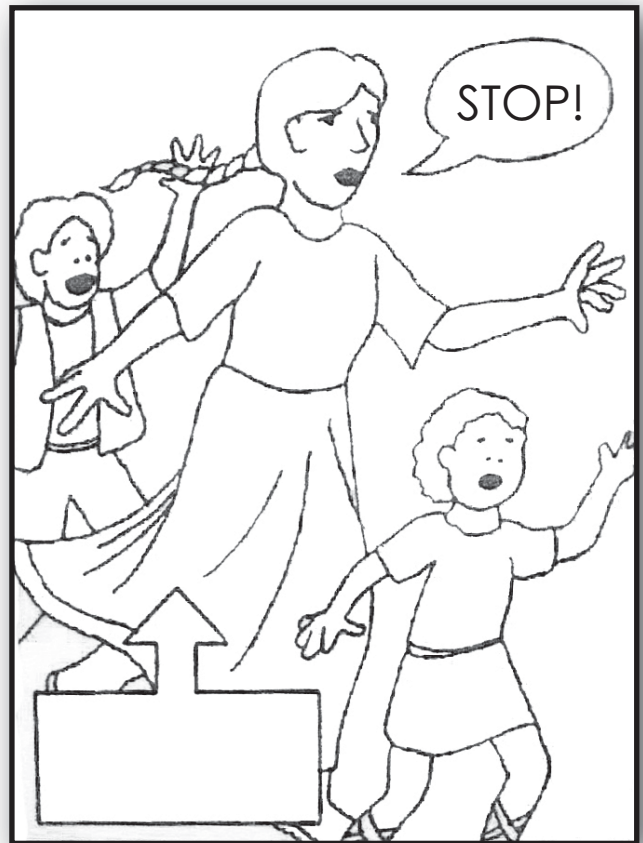

4. What did God do? (Look at verse 10.)



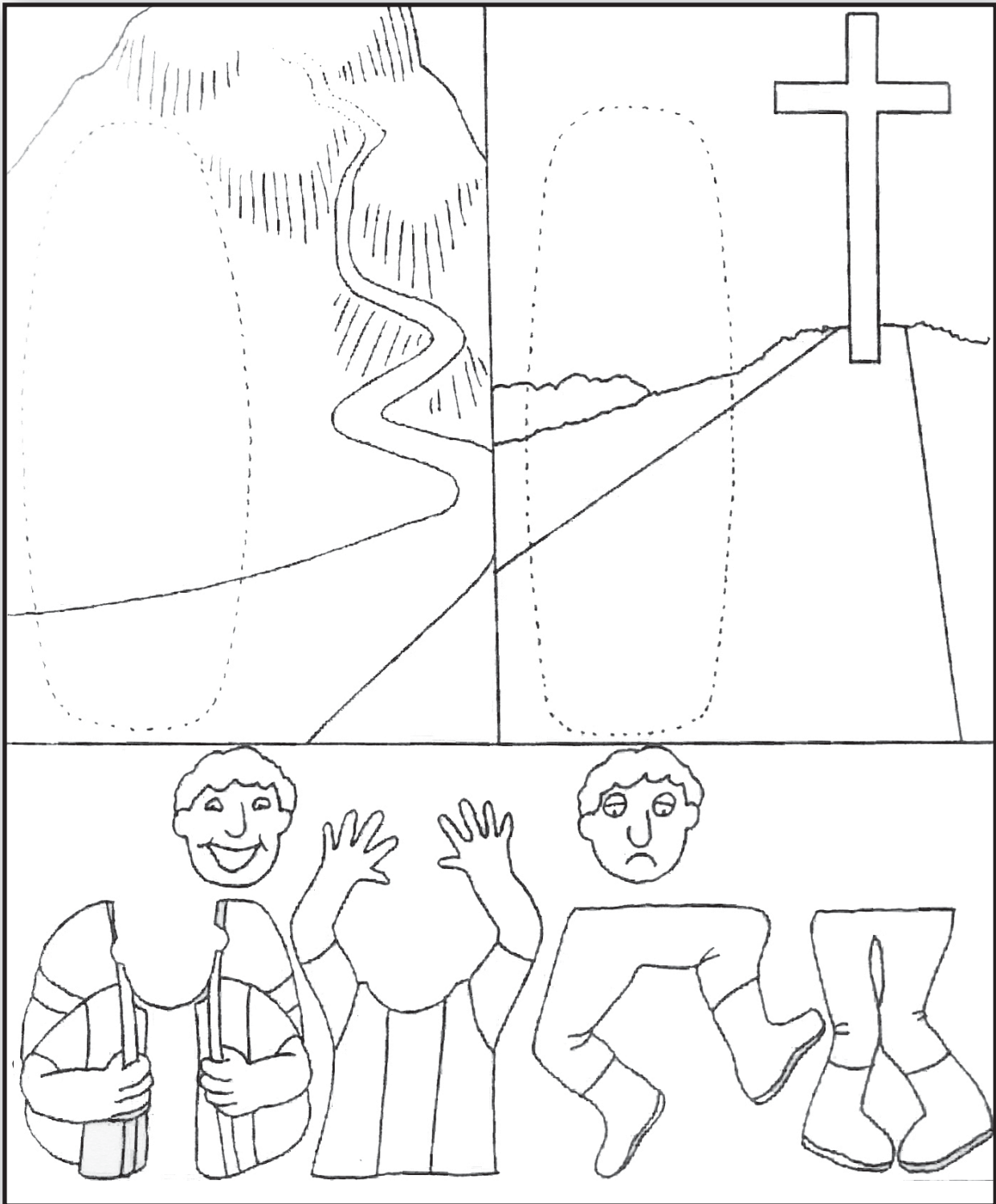
God has told us that he is angry with the way people live and the bad things we do. So he is going to end the world. Ask yourself, 'What should I do?'
