When Jesus prayed in the Gospels, He was really talking to Himself. When God/the LORD is mentioned in the Old Testament, it is referring only to God the Father. Those who deny the Trinity are not true Christians. There is one God, but he changes between different forms – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – like water, steam and ice. The Trinity is taught by the Bible. The Trinity is like God wearing three different sets of clothes according to the job he's doing at the time. The Son of God was the first and most glorious of the Father's creations. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are three separate Gods. The Father, the Son and the Spirit are equally 'God'. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are the three parts of God. The Father is not the same person as the Son, who is not the same person as the Holy Spirit, who is not the same person as the Father. Since the Bible teaches that the Son is 'begotten' of the Father, there must have been a time when he began to exist. It is alright to call Jesus Son of God, but not to call him God. God operated first as the Father in creation, then as the Son in redemption, and now operates as the Spirit in sanctification. God has always existed in three persons. Father, Son and Holy Spirit are to do with how we experience God, not to do with how God is in himself. Each person of the Trinity thinks of himself as 'l' and the other persons of the Trinity as 'You.'
