A note about chapters and verses

Throughout Mark's book you will see some large numbers and some smaller numbers. The larger numbers are the chapters Mark has been split into. The smaller numbers are the verses that make up each chapter. The chapters and verses weren't in the original but have been added later to help us find our way around. We often use a kind of shorthand so that Mark chapter 1 and verse 1 will be written as "**Mark 1:1**" or sometimes as "**Mark 1 v 1**".



Mark tells us about the amazing things Jesus did and said. He also tells us where Jesus was at the time. Use the map to help you follow the story as Jesus travels around the country of Israel.
